Lived in or rather moved to Alabama in 1818. Jackson Co. from Cumberland Co., Ky., was a farmer, had tannery, grist and saw mill. (Was in Marion Co. Tenn. in 1850 census.) His father was WILLIAM LONG, b. Northern Ireland. ARTHUR'S wife was Jane (Jennie) Williams, b. 18 May 1797 Cumberland Co., Ky., d. 30 Jul 1866 Jackson Co., Al., buried Old Baptist Cemetery near Edgefield School, Jackson Co., Al. Moved to Jackson Co., Al. in 1818. Her father was Hardin Williams and mother was Jane Hart.

LONG and the said SARAH A. LONG her heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims of all persons I also warrant said negro girl to be sound healthy sensible and a slave for life.

Copy of Will of CRAWFORD LONG

State of Georgia  
 Hancock County

In the name of God Amen! I CRAWFORD LONG of said state and county being advanced in age and knowing that I must surely die deem it right and proper both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence (?) has blessed me, do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others made by me heretofore, by me.

First then I leave and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian manner. 2nd Then I leave and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors herein after appointed as I am \_\_\_\_\_ my creditors should be delayed in their right especially(?) as there is no necessity for delay.

3rd Item I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife ANNEY LONG all my property both real and personal and perishable during her life, and after her death I give it all to my daughter Martha E. Kelley and my son DAN'L LONG during their lives - after their deaths I desire that it all be sold and equally divided between HENRY LONG, JACKSON LONG, LANKIN R. LONG'S child WILLIAM G. LONG. My daughter Martha Kelly's part after her death to go to her three children.

4th Item I hereby constitute my friend Washington H. Brantley Executor for this my last will and testament This July 24, 1864.

Signed sealed disclosed delivered and published by CRAWFORD LONG to be his last will and testament in presence of us, the subscribers who subscribed our names hereto in the presence of said testator at his special instance request and of each other.

Notes from George Barksdale: It appears that the administrator of CRAWFORD LONG'S estate died without completing the distribution of the assets of the estate. The Court finally designated CRAWFORD'S grandsons A. C. and J. S. LONG to complete the estate distribution. The final report was made on April 6, 1901. The individuals named in the distribution coincide with information in possession of ALEC S. LONG, Culverton, Ga. who is a son of the A. S. LONG in the record. ALEC LONG has indicated to me that all those named his relatives, and all are descended from CRAWFORD LONG. I have previously indicated to you that descendants of WILLIS SHELTON LONG of Houston County, Alabama believe that WILLIS was a son of CRAWFORD LONG. WILLIS LONG was not named in CRAWFORD LONG'S will, however circumstantial evidence strongly suggests that WILLIS was actually a son of CRAWFORD LONG. The 1850 census of Hancock County, Georgia lists only 3 of the 4 sons of CRAWFORD LONG who were shown in the age bracket of under 10 in the 1820 census of Hancock County. WILLIS LONG was of the correct age to have been the fourth son in the under 10 age group.

FRANCIS, SR. served in Co. H 4th Miss. Cav. during the Civil War. The family moved to Tyler, Smith Co., Tx. 1891 where he was a tailor. What happened to Mattie is not known, but about 1896 FRANCIS married a Mary (b. about 1861 Tx.) The 1900 Tyler, Smith Co., Tx. census shows:

 In 1915 FRANCIS, SR. entered the Texas Confederate Home at Austin. He died there in 1936, his body returned to Tyler for burial. I am trying to locate his gravesite. FRANK, JR. was a telegraph operator at the railroad office in 1900. Who, if anyone did he marry, and did he leave any descendants? He died 1921 Smith Co. Did his sister GERTRUDE marry and leave descendants? One MRS. MARY LONG (age 64) died 1928 Smith Co. Was this the 2nd wife of FRANCIS, SR.? His mortuary records show him as a widower.

## WILLIAM H. LONG

WILLIAM H. LONG, McCoysville, Juniata Co., Pa., son of HENRY and BANDENA (Flickenger) LONG, was born near Ickesburg, Perry, November 23, 1837. His grandfather, HENRY LONG, a farmer or wagon-maker removed from Adams County to Perry County and settled near Ickesburg, where he owned a farm of 102 acres. Being a progressive farmer, he made many improvements upon his place, on which he lived the rest of his life. Loyal to the religious beliefs of his German ancestors. MR. LONG was a consistent member of the Lutheran Church. He married and raised a family of 8 children, one of whom was HENRY, father of WILLIAM H. LONG.

HENRY LONG received only a common school education, but had a thorough knowledge of both the German and English language. Like his father, he was a farmer and wagon-maker working at the former in the summer and the latter in the winter. His farm near Ickesburg consisted of 160 acres, and on it he built a new barn, planted an orchard and made all other improvements requisite to a first class farm. At various times, he was also extensively engaged in raising stock. MR. LONG was married near Ickesburg, to Rachel Cox and they had one child, which died young, the wife died also. His second wife was Barbara Vochem and their two children were: LYDIA, widow of William Hench, and a child that died young, BARBARA. MR. LONG then married BANDENA, daughter of Henry Flickinger, a showmaker of Ickesburg. They had five children:

MARGARET, widow of Daniel Rice of Perry Co.

WILLIAM H.

SAMUEL S., died in the army.

SARAH, wife of Ananias Bird, of Perry Co.

ELIZA JANE, deceased.

Formerly a Democrat, MR. LONG later joined the Republican Party, and served as supervisor and School Director of his township. After the death of his wife, which occurred near Ickesburg in 1863, he resided in Tuscarora twonship, Juniata County, with his son, WILLIAM H. LONG and died there in 1876, at the age of 82 years. He was an Elder in the Lutheran Church, was well known and highly esteemed as a citizen and neighbor.

WILLIAM H. LONG attended the public school of Tuscarora Township, Juniata County. During his early manhood, he worked for his father, and on reaching his thirteenth year, he bought the homestead and cultivated it until 1871, when he sold out and came to Juniata County. He there purchased the Schwab farm of 92 acres, 75 acres being under improvement and furthered increased its value by planting an orchard. Besides farming with good success, MR. LONG makes the raising of fine live stock a very profitable business. He is a Republican and has been township assessor, and for three years a school director.

MR. LONG is one of the most prominent men in the district, and is well-liked and respected by all. MR. LONG is fond of good reading and is a very genial and intelligent man.

ABRAHAM LONG and CATHERINE (HERSHEY) LONG

ABRAHAM LONG, retired, Millerstown, Perry Co., Pa. The great grandfather came from France and settled in Lancaster Co., Pa., where he engaged in farming. Lise most of his nationality he sympathized with the Colonists in the Revolutionary struggle, and served as a soldier during the war.

DAVID LONG, grandfather of ABRAHAM LONG was born in Lancaster Co., Pa., in 1814 and bought the old Spahr farm in Greenwood township, where he resided until his death. He was successful in business and came into the possession of large tracts of land; he gave a farm to each of his sons. His death ocured on the homestead about 1858, at the age of abo about 80 years. He married Miss Catherine Hershey, of Lancaster Co., Pa. whose death ocured previous to his own. Their sons were:

CHRISTIAN, died in Liverpool Township, Perry County

ABRAHAM

DAVID, died in Tuscarora Township, Juniata County

BENJAMIN, died in Greenwood Township

Their daughters were:

CATHERINE, married John Ulsh, and died in Liverpool Township, He removed to Indiana, married again, and died there.

NANCY, married Simon Barter, and both died in Ohio.

ELIZABETH, married Henry Kauffman, and both died in Greenwood Twp.

MR. LONG was one of the organizers of the United Brethern Church, it having been formed in his house, and he was an itinerant minister in that denomination as long as he was able to travel.

ABRAHAM LONG, SR., father of ABRAHAM LONG, was born in Lancaster Co., in 1796, and when 18 years of age, came with his parents to Perry Co., where he married Mary Kauffman, who was born in Perry County in 1794. They settled on a part of the farm which his father bought from Mr. Spahr, and resided there until his death in 1853. He also owned another farm. He was an old line Whig. His spiritual fellowship was with the U.B. Church. His wife's death occurred 5 years before him. Their children were:

ELIZABETH, died age 14 years.

DAVID C., married and reared 2 children, both of whom are living. He died in 1855.

ABRAHAM LONG, JR. was born October 4, 1825, on the old homestead in Greenwood Township, Perry Co., Pa., where he had his residence until 1892. He then retired from active business and took up his residence at Millerstown. His education was received in the Common Schools, but his assistance being almost always needed on the farm, he had only limited opportunities for pursuing his studies. He became a farmer and pursued this occupation through life, succeeding to the old homestead at the death of his father. On Nov. 13, 1851, he was married to Miss Catherine Kepner, born in Greenwood Township, daughter of David and Susanna Buser. Their children are:

MARY C., married Dr. J. C. Oelling and resides in Greencastle, Franklin Co., Pa.

THEODORE K., graduate of the Yale College Law School, now an Attorney-at-Law, Chicago, Il., practiced for some year in Dakota, married Kate Carson of Eau Claire, Wi.

IDA, (Mrs. Adam Holman) resides on the old homestead, has six children.
