

MILITARY SERVICE AND PENSION

JAMES B. LONG enlisted at Terre Haute, Indiana as a Substitute for Solomon Garner on the 27th day of Sept 1864 by R. W. Thompson, G. R. Steele and A. G. Preston, Board of Enrollment, 7th Dist. of Indiana.

Declaration of Substitute: I, JAMES B. LONG desiring to enlist in the Army of the United States, for One yaer, do declare, That I am 18 years and no months of age; that I have never been discharged from the Unite United States service on account of disability or by sentence of a court martial; and that I know of no impediment to my serving honestly and faithfully as a soldier for one year. Given at Terre Haute, Indi- ana the 27th day of Sept 1864.

Substitute Volunteer Enlistment

I, JAMES B. LONG born in the State of Kentucky, aged eighteen years, and by occupation a farmer, Do hereby Acknowledge to have agreed with Solomon Gardner, Esq. of Dick Johnson, township of Clay County, Indi- ana to become his SUBSTITUTE in the Military Service, for a sufficient consideration paid and delivered to me, on the Twenty Seventh day of September 1864; and having this agreed with said Solomon Garner, I do hereby acknowledge to have enlisted this Twenty Seventh day of Sept. 1864, to serve as a Soldier in the Army of the United State of America, for the period of one year, unless sooner discharged by proper author- ity; I do also agree to accept such bounty, pay, ration and clothing, as are, or may be, established by law for soldiers. And I do solemnly swear that I will bear true and faithful allegiance to the United States of America; and that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their enemies or opposers whomsoever; and that I will observe and obey the orders of the President of the United States, and the orders of the Officers appointed over me, according to the Rules and Articles of War.

We certify, on honor, That we have carefully examined the above-named Volunteer Substitute agreeably to the Regulations, and that, in our opinion, he is free from all bodily defects and mental infirmity which would in any way disqualify him from performing the duties of a sold- ier, that he was entirely sober when enlisted, that he is of lawful age, (not under 18 years) and that, in accepting him as duly qualified to perform the duties of an able-bodied soldier, and as a Substitute in lien of Solomon Garner, drafted in Dick Johnson, Twp. Clay Co., Ind. Sep. 27, 1864, we have strictly observed the Regulations which govern

## DECLARATION FOR INVALID ARMY PENSION

State of Indiana  
County of Clay

On this 16th day of May A.D., one thousand eight hundred and seventy four personally appeared before me Geo. E. Hubbard Clerk of the Circuit Court within and for the County and State aforesaid JAMES B. LONG aged 27 years, a resident of (blank) in the County of Clay in the State of Indiana who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical JAMES B. LONG who enlisted in the service of the United States at Indianapolis, County of Marion, State of Indiana on the 27th day of September in the year 1864, as a Private in Company D commanded by Captain Thomas Daily in the 22nd Regiment of Indiana Infantry Vols in the war 1861 and was honorably discharged near Washington, State of D. C. on the 9th day of June in the year 1865; that while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty He received a Sun Stroke on the 25th or 31st day of May 1865. vs: On or about the last of May 1865 was struck down by a Sun Stroke. From the effects of said Sun Stroke I have lost the sight of one eye and the sight of the other is impaired. Have not been able to follow my occupation wise trade half of the time since receiving my Sun Stroke. Remarks: Not in any hospital.

He has not been in the military, naval, marine or civil service of the United States since the 9th day of June, 1865. Since leaving the service he has resided in the County of Clay in the State of Indiana and his occupation has been farming. When enrolled he was a farmer and for the purpose of prosecuting his claim, he hereby appoints B. F. PRITHCARD, of, Indianapolis, State of Indiana, his attorney in fact, with power of substitution and with authority to receive his pension certificate. He requests that his pension be paid at Indianapolis, State of Indiana. His postoffice address is Bowling Green, County of Clay and State of Indiana.

LONG sign to the foregoing declaration and power of attorney; and they further swear that they have every reason to believe from the appearance of the applicant and their acquaintance with him, that he is the identical person he represents himself to be; and that they have known him for ten years last past; that prior to enlistment he was a farmer. Since leaving the service his habits have been uniformly good and his occupation has been farming. They further state they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim. Alpheus Dillon and Geo. E. Hubbard sign as witnesses to mark. Levi (his mark) Orman and Frederick Crouse sign as two identifying witnesses.

LONG, aged 58 years, a resident of Stone, County of Ellis, State of Oklahoma who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of JAMES B. LONG, who enlisted under the name of JAMES B. LONG, on the 27th day of Sept, A.D. 1864, as a Private, in Comapnay D in the 22nd Regiment of Indiana Inf. Vols., and served at least ninety days in the late War of the Rebellion, in the service of the United States, who was honorably discharged June 9th, 1865, and died Dec. 31st, 1908 at Oakland, Kansas. That he was not employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above. That he was never employed in the military or naval service of the United States after the 9th day of June 1865. That she was married under the name of Mary A. Godfrey to said JAMES B. LONG on the 2nd day of August, A.D. 1867 by Justice of the Peace of Porugal, Indiana (Samuel M. Stewart), there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had been previously married, that her said husband had not been previously married. That she was divorced from her first husband, John H. Godfrey at Clay County, Ind. That she has not remarried since the death of the said JAMES B. LONG. That no prior application for pension has been filed by herself but the soldier, JAMES B. LONG was a pensioner on Act. No. 328404 under the Great Law That she asks allowance to her of the pension due him to his death. That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States, under the provisions of the act of April 19, 1908. She hereby appoints, with full power of substitution, and revocation, Patrick H. Coney of Topeka, Kansas her true and lawful attorney to prosecute her claim, the fee to be Ten Dollars, payable as prescribed by law. ARTHUR B. LONG

ARTHUR B. LONG, deceased, formerly of Lewistown, Mifflin Co., Pa. was the son of JAMES LONG, and was born Nov. 5, 1806 in Lancaster County. He obtained his education in the "Subscription Schools" which preceded the introduction of the common school system. At the age of fifteen (15) he journeyed on foot from Lancaster County to Mifflin County. Here he found a home with his aunt, Mrs. Mary C. Reed, wife of Thomas Reed. From his uncle, MR. LONG learned the trade of wagon-making, which calling he followed in Lewistown, purchasing in that borough a shop and a lot, upon which he not long after built a comfortable home.

He was married in 1829, and for four years after continued in the quiet pursuit of his trade, with encouraging prosperity. In 1833, MR. LONG and his father-in-law, William Shaw, built the Mount Rock Flour Mills at Lewistown, and conducted them with success for about 10 years. At the end of that time, having become interested in the manufacture of threshing machine, with a very flattering prospect for a lucrative trade, MR. LONG sold out his interest in the flour mills. His next venture was the purchase of the right to manufacture the well known, now old fashioned "Hathaway Stove", for sale in six counties. His foundry was built at Lewistown. This enterprise proved a very successful one. Not to his furnace investments. The erection of the Isabelle Furnace at Lewistown, in which he was a partner, and the renting of the Hope Furnace, also in Mifflin County, were the occasion of what would have been to any man of less sound judgment, equanimity and tact, total and irretrievable ruins. His spirit and determination conquered circumstances, and we find him soon again in possession of the Isabelle Furnace, which had been sold out by the sheriff, and filling large a profitable contract with the railroad companies. One of these, a contract with the Pennsylvania Railroad Company for the construction of reservoirs and water tanks continued in force for 28 years, long enough for him to place himself once more on a firm basis, satisfying all his creditors in full.

MR. LONG now became largely interested in coal and timber lands in Clearfield County, Pa., and some time later, associated with himself in these interest his sons, WILLIAM JAMES and GEORGE HENRY. These lands were afterwards leased at a royalty for thirty (30) years. The LONG'S purchased extensive woodlands near Grand Rapids, Michigan. The Michigan interest is now under the management of his son, GEORGE H. LONG.

MR. LONG was warmly and actively interested in public affairs. He was an adherent of the Whig party, so long as it existed, and afterwards became a Republican. He never desired or accepted public office.

ARTHUR B. LONG, was married December 1, 1829 to Anna Eliza, daughter of William and Catherine (Watson) Shaw. Two of their children, ROBERT WATSON and ANNA MARY died in childhood; Those surviving are:

ARTHUR B. LONG died in his 78th year, June 23, 1884. He was a deacon of the Lewistown Presbyterian Church, of which he had for many years been a faithful and active member. He was a lover of sacred music. He not only organized the first choir of the Lewistown congregation but promoted in every way the improvement of that part of the worship.

ALBERT B. LONG, youngest son of ARTHUR B. and ANNA ELIZA (Shaw) LONG, was educated in the Common Schools and at the academy of Lewistown. On attaining his majority he became identified with the lumber interests at Grand Rapids, Mich., with his father and brothers. MR. LONG is a Republican, and adheres firmly to party principles. He resides in West Market Street, Lewistown, Pa.

ALBERT B. LONG was married September 8, 1880, to Sara Jane, daughter of Oliver C. and Anna Eliza Chesney. Two of their five children are deceased. Those surviving are:
