

WILL OF WILLIAM LONG
Putnam County, Indiana

I, WILLIAM LONG, of the County of Putnam and State of Indiana, being of sound mind and memory, knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do make this my last Will and Testament (to Wit) 1st: I give and bequeath to my beloved wife, HARRIET LONG, the home farm adjoining the town of New Maysville, Indiana, containing (255) two hundred and thirty-five acres, during her natural life, with the proceeds there of; being the East half of North East quarter section (34) thirty four, containing seventy-five acres more or less; also the North West quarter of section (35) thirty-five; all in Twonship sixteen, north of range (3) three west. Also my household and kitchen furniture, also the wheat and other provisions on hand together with the fowls on the farm, also fifteen hundred dollars in cash out of any money on hand. The balance of my personal property not herein named to be sold to the highest bidder at my death on twelve months or after my death whatever may be on hand either of personal notes or other debts after the above bequest are paid, shall be collected and equally divided among my legal heirs. Also at the death of my wife, HARRIET LONG, my farm, as above described together with whatever personal or other cr. shall be on hand shall be sold moneys collected and divided equally among my legal heirs. Given under my hand this 31st day of July 1877, hereby revoking all other wills. Done in the presence and signed by me before A. Bowen and Jacob Williamson.

CODICIL TO THE FOREGOING WILL

1st: In addition to the foregoing I will that there shall be one quarter of an acre of ground reserved on my home farm reserved from sale at the death of my wife on which I wish to be buried with right to and from said ground to the public highway.

2nd: I give and bequeath to my son ROBERT W. LONG and Matilda C. Stone to be given the sum of four hundred dollars to make them equal with my other children. To be paid out of any money or personal property that may be on hand at my death if there is not sufficient money or property on hand at my death then the same shall be paid at the death of my wife before any division is made with the other children. Added and dated this 24th day of August 1877.

The State of Indiana, Putnam County, SS: Be it remembered, that on the 20th day of May 1880, Anthony Bowen, one of the subscribing witnesses to the within and foregoing last Will and Testament of WILLIAM LONG, late of said County, deceased, personally appeared before the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Putnam County, in the State of Indiana, and being duly sworn by the Clerk of said Court, upon his oath declared

and testified as follows, that is to say: That on the 31st day of July 1877, he saw the said WILLIAM LONG sign his name to said instrument in writing as and for his last Will and Testament; and that this deponent at the same time heard the said WILLIAM LONG declare the said instrument in writing to be his last Will and Testament, and that the said instrument in writing at the same time at the request of the said WILLIAM LONG with his consent attested and subscribed by the said _____ and Jacob Williamson in the presence of said testator, and in presence of each other as subscribing witnesses thereto, and the said WILLIAM LONG was, at the time of the signing and subscribing of said instrument, as foresaid, of full age, (that is, more than twenty-one years of age) and of sound and disposing mind and memory, and not under any coercion or restraint, as the said deponent verily believes, and further deponent says not. CORRECTION TO LONG DATA
 Sent by George Barksdale-P.O. Box 127-
 Cottondale, Fl. 32431

Letters of Nov 18, 1979 and Feb. 12, 1980 I made references to the parentage of DAVIS LONG'S wife, Elizabeth Pickard. In subsequent correspondence with Mrs. Nancy P. Large of Birmingham, Alabama, I have obtained information which combined with information from Mrs. Mary Lee Keith of Carrollton, Texas it is established positively that Elizabeth Pickard was a daughter of Micajah Pickard and his wife Sarah Barksdale. By further communication with Kenneth H. Thomas, Jr., Decatur, Ga. it is established that the John Pickard mentioned in the above letters, was a brother of Micajah Pickard. I might add that ELIZABETH (Pickard) LONG was a grand daughter of Jeffery Barksdale and his wife Phebe.

My letter of July 26, 1982 I inferred that Thomas M. Turner was a brother-in-law of my great uncle, Alfred Barksdale. Subsequent access to the records of administration of the estate of Frances H. Patterson revealed that no relationship existed between Thomas M. Turner and the Patterson heirs.

Information from the book "Genealogical Abstracts of Wills 1758-1824 Halifax County, North Carolina" by Margaret M. Hoffman suggests that LITTLETON LONG'S wife, Martha Shelton was a daughter of Lademon Shelton and Ruth Robinson. This appears to confirm the listing on the family sheet of DAVIS LONG, that his mother, Martha Shelton Long was a daughter of Lademon and Ruth Robinson Shelton. Also, the name given to one of Lademon Shelton's sons strongly suggests that the WILLIS SHELTON LONG mentioned in one of my letters was in fact a son of CRAWFORD LONG and a grandson of LITTLETON LONG.

I still have not made a positive identification of the parents of my great great grandfather, LITTLETON LONG.

JOSEPH G. LONG

JOSEPH G. LONG, East Salem, Juniata Co., Pa. was born Friday, 15 Jan 1819 in Greenwood Twonship, Perry Co. He is a son of CHRISTIAN and NANCY (Gable) LONG. The original German spelling of the name was LANG. The great-grandfather of JOSEPH G. LONG from Baden, Germany, to Lancaster Co., Pa. at a very early period in the history of the colony.

DAVID LONG, grandfather of JOSEPH G. LONG, born in Lancaster County was a farmer by occupation, and removed to Perry County in 1814, settling in Pfoutz Valley, where he purchased a large tract of land on which he passed the remainder of his days. At his death the land was divided among his children. He was married in Lancaster County to Miss Catherine Hershey, a native of the County. To this union was born eight children:

In his early life LR. LONG was a Whig. He was a member of the Menmonite Church, and afterwards a member of the U.S. Church, in which body he was an Elder and Minister. A man of prosinace in the community, he was universally respected. Both he and his wife died on thier farm in Pfoutz valley.

CHRISTIAN LONG, eldest child of DAVID LONG, had only a German education, which he received in Lancaster County where he remained until he moved with parents to Perry County. Owing 230 acres of land, he made farming his life occupation. He was married in Lancaster County, to a native of that County, of German descent, To this union was born 14 children:

MR. LONG was a Whig in Politics. In the United Brethern Church, of which he was a consistent and zealous member, he held the office of Elder. Highly respected by all who knew him. MR. LONG died in Liverpool Township, Perry County in 1856.

JOSEPH G. LONG was married at Liverpool, Perry County in 1845, to Miss Mary A. Kauffman, a native of Greenwood Township, Perry County and a daughter of Henry Kauffman, a farmer of that township. To this union 7 children were born:

His wife having died, his second marriage took place in Fayette Township, Juniata County, January 1874, with Miss Rose Isenberg, born in Huntingdon Co. and a daughter of David and Agnes (Nooney) Isenberg. To this union one child was born: DAVID I., residing on the homestead. MR. LONG has filled various offices. He was for one term a school director of Fayette Township, Juniata County; for two years he was Justice of the Peace in Liverpool Twp., Perry Co., and in 1891 he was elected to the same office in Delaware Twp, Juniata Co., which he filled for a term of 5 years, his judgments always giving satisfaction to the community, and never being reversed by the higher courts. While holding this office he united several couples in the bonds of matrimony. In politics MR. LONG is a Republican. He is a consistent member of the M. E. Church, and was for many years identified with the Sunday School work. He has been a member of the I.O.O.F.

CONFEDERATE SERVICE RECORD

A photostat of a muster roll, not dated, lists one Private J. T. LONG who enlisted July 29, 1861, Troy, Alabama by Captain Hamner and served with Company H, 18th Alabama Volunteer Regiment. He was last paid by Major Hodge, November 30, 1861.

In his personal statement made to the Tax Assessor of Pike Co., Ala., 1907, JOHN THOMAS LONG stated that he enlisted July 17, 1861, Troy, Al., and served as a private with Company H, 18th Alabama Infantry Regiment. He was captured at Nashville, Tenn., December 1864 and was discharged July 1865 at Camp Chase, Ohio.

We have in our files the pension applications of JOHN THOMAS LONG and his widow, MRS. AMY JANE LONG, which were filed in Pike Co., Alabama. Xerox copies of these pension applications can be furnished.





COURT RECORDS OF CUMBERLAND CO., KENTUCKY

Court Records of Cumberland Co., 14 Apr 1841 - state Heirs of William Frogg, Dec'd. Wesley Neatherly and wife Elizabeth, Batson Carroll and wife Rebecca, James Blankenship and wife Polly, PATSY LONG, WILLIAM LONG and ELIZABETH LONG.

Wm. Frogg was the son of Wm. Frogge and Mary Mitchell. he m. Mary Merit in 1804 Cumberland Co., Ky. He died in 1828 and Mary died in 1845 in Andrew Co., Mo. It seems that 21 wagons left Kentucky for Missouri in 1841. The Blankenships and Carrolls were part of the caravan. Am sure the Frogges and LONGS had connections back in Va. Will of John Lewis (Husband of Margaret Frogge) proved 21 Sep 1790. Wit: Agatha Lewis Frogg Stuart and WILLIAM LONG.

Augusta Co., Va. 1774 - John and Agatha Frogge sell to Wm. Bowyer - lots adjacent to William Lewis and WILLIAM LONG.

There is also a reference to a POLLY LONG in the Will of Oliver Duvall He mentions that she had two natural children by him?? He anmes them and leaves money to them.
