The PENNSYLVANIA - CANADA LINK

My research begins in Kenora, Ontario where my grandmother ESTELLA (STELLA) LONG was born in 1911. She lived her entire life in the Kenora area. As a young girl she lived in Jaffray-Melick on a farm. The farm faced Round Lake and when Cecilia Jeffray School was built her father sold some of his farmland for the site of the school. The ruins of the barn are still visible. My grandmother had four brothers: ROBERT (never married), WILLIAM (married Wynard Spencer and had two children), ELMER (married Lorraine Lacombe and had five children), and JOHN (married Rosa Duquette and had seven children and married Kay Boile). My grandmother's only sister ISABEL (born 1907) died in 1915 from ruptured tonsils. ROBERT, WILLIAM, ELMER and STELLA remained in the Kenora area. My grandmother married Paul Leroux and had only one daughter Pauline. My grandmother's only living brother is JOHN, who moved to Terrace Bay, Ontario and raised his family there.

STELLA LONG was the daughter of WILBERT and MARY LONG. MARY (Kinney) LONG was born in Gracefield, Quebec in 1884. Her family moved to the Kenora-Keewatin area about 1889. As a young woman, she and her sister MARGARET worked as waitresses at the Hilliard House and on the S. S. Kenora.

I have been unable to find the marriage record of MARY and WILBERT LONG. They were married about 1905 in the Methodist Church. WILBERT was born in 1882 in Waterdown, (near Hamilton), Ontario. He moved from Waterdown to Kenora as a young man. He had the following brothers and sisters: ISABEL (married E. Philpotts), ADELINE (born 1874 never married), ELLEN, (born 1880 never married), GORDON, JOHN E. (born 1876), ROBERT, (born 1878), ERNEST and possibly JOSEPH (married E. Fidler). All of these brothers and sisters with the exception of JOSEPH and JOHN remained in the Hamilton area. JOSEPH moved to Kenora and JOHN moved to Denver, Colorado.

WILBERT LONG was very involved in community affairs in Jaffray-Melick. He was the reeve of the town and his picture hangs in the town office. He was active in the Agricultural Society and the annual fair. WILBERT died in 1935 and MARY died in 1956 and both are buried in Kenora.

WILBERT was the son of JOHN R. LONG and Minerva Ironside. Minerva was born in 1852 in Ontario (according to the census record) and was the daughter of Robert and Ellen Ironside who resided in Beverly township (near Hamilton). JOHN R. LONG was born in 1852 in Ontario to JOHN LONG and Emily Shannon. JOHN R. LONG and Minerva Ironside were married on October 29, 1873 in Waterdown, Ontario.

JOHN R. LONG'S father, JOHN LONG (born 1815 Ontario) was married twice. His first wife was Emily Shannon (born 1819) and they were on 26 August 1844. JOHN and EMILY had the following children: WILLIAM J. (born 1846), JACOB (born 1848), MARGARET (born 1851), JOHN R. (born 1852), HAGER (born 1855), MARY (born 1860). According to the 1861 census, JOHN and EMILY LONG and their children lived on Concession 3 Lot 12 in Waterdown. There were 130 acres and a 1 storey brick house with a total value of \$16,000. The census states that the house was built in 1853. EMILY died in 1862 and is buried in Waterdown Union Cemetery. JOHN married again, this time to Adaline Glover (born 1831). They had the following children, including two sets of twins: GEORGE and CLARA (born 1863), THOMAS M. and ALICE S. (born 1865), BARBARA (born 1868), BENNETT E. (born 1870), HENRY (born 1876), and MATILDA J. (born 1872). Adaline died in 1915 according to her tombstone in Waterdown Union although no

record exists at the Archives. ADALINE is buried next to EMILY and several children are also buried there. The Wentworth County Atlas of 1875 states that JOHN LONG of Lot 12 Conc. 3 of E. Flamboro was born in Canada and was a farmer and school trustee. JOHN probably died between 1876 and 1881, although no record of his death or burial has yet been found.

Next to the graves of ADALINE and EMILY is the grave of WILLIAM LONG, born 1782, d. 1858. According to the 1851 census WILLIAM and J. LONG lived on Lot 12 Conc. 3 and shared this lot with John Stock. They also shared Lot 13 Conc. 3 with Thomas Fortin and John Kaylis (?). Both lots were 150 acres. It is possible that WILLIAM LONG is the brother of JOHN LONG but it more likely that he is JOHN'S father, which would mean that WILLIAM is buried with his two daughters-in-law.

After researching the land petitions at the Public Archives, it is evident that the LONG family had tried to rent this lot for several years. In 1809 JACOB and JOSEPH LONG requested this land and also requested Lot 9 Conc. 3. They were denied because JACOB could not produce an Oath of Allegiance certificate nor a certificate of character. In 1811, WILLIAM LONG applied for Lot 12 with David Cummins. He stated on the application that he had lived in E. Flamboro for ten years (since 1801). The petition was granted in December 1811 with a rent of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ 2s6p. In 1836 WILLIAM applied to purchase the lot. There is no further confirmation of this on microfilm.

How and when did the LONG family come to Canada? The following information is pieced together from the land petitions found at the Public Archives. Most of the information cannot be confirmed.

Between the years 1788 and 1801 at least five brothers came to Canada from Pennsylvania. The first to arrive was ELIAS LONG and his wife Catherine Morden (daughter of Ralph Morden and Ann Durham), and three children. Catherine's father was executed in Easton Pennsylvania on 25 November 1780 for helping Robert Land escape from the Revolutionary soldiers. Land was the first settler in Hamilton (then Barton). Widow Ann Morden U.E.L. was the first settler in Dundas and later lived in London, Ontario. ELIAS LONG settled on Lot 46 Conc. 3 in Ancaster township. A survey in 1791 of Barton shows ELIAS and JACOB LONG getting 300 acres, Ann Morden 100 acres and Robert Land 300 acres. One story states that ELIAS was shot in Dundas while talking to Lord Simcoe.

ELIAS' brother JACOB LONG applied for land in 1796. His petition states he is from Pennsylvania, took the Oath of Allegiance and has lived in Canada for 2 years. He also says he arrived with a wife and seven children and currently resides with Wm. Rambles in Barton. In 1800 he again applied for land. This time he requested land on Dundas St., west of Burlington Bay. This location describes Lot 12 Conc. 3 later lived on by WILLIAM LONG. It is possible that in the 1851 census the J. LONG living with WILLIAM LONG is in fact JACOB LONG (WILLIAM'S father) although he would have been very old if this is true.

JACOB also had three more brothers who came to Canada from Pennsylvania and who applied for land. CHRISTIAN LONG came to Canada in 1799 with a wife and seven children. He first settled in Willoughby then on Lot 31 and 32 Conc. 7 in Markham. He acted as an attorney for his brother WILLIAM in 1803. WILLIAM came to Canada in 1801 with a wife and seven children. He settled in Grimsby and then on Lot 33 Conc. 7 in Markham. Another PHILIP LONG arrived with a wife and one child in 1795. He lived with JACOB in Barton when he applied for land in 1798. As there is no specific

place given, the next problem is where did the LONG family live in Pennsylvania?
A trip to the Library of Congress provided some possibilities.

History of the LONG FAMILY of Pennsylvania (1930) by WM. G. LONG has a wealth of information. In this book there is a generation chart tracing several generations from a CHRISTIAN LANG, b. 1664 near Langen, Hesse, Germany, who arrived in Philadelphia, Pa. in 1683-84 and later settled in Lancaster, Pa. CHRISTIAN had many children including another CHRISTIAN LANG who died in 1762. He resided on land on Mill Creek, Earl Twp., Lancaster Co., Pa. He married Ann Margaret and had many children including a son ABRAHAM. ABRAHAM married Mary, lived in New Holland, Lancaster Co., Pa., and had at least two sons, JACOB LAND and CHRISTIAN LANG. This line of the family seems to stop at this point and nothing more is known about them. Could JACOB and CHRISTIAN be the same men who moved their families to Canada via Niagara? The dates would be about right and names seem to correspond. If this assumption is correct, WM. G. LONG'S book provides more information about other branches of this family.

The family has very little information on SANFRANCISCO LONG, even tho several of his grandchildren are still alive, and one daughter-in-laws Iva Pearl (Buckmaster) LONG. The grandchildren, and some of the great grandchildren say that both

SANFRANCISCO and his wife had Indian blood. SANFRANCISCO'S children said their father could have applied for Indian land in Oklahoma, but said that he felt that it was too much trouble to prove his right. HORACE BOADMAN LONG is our family line, he is my husband's grandfather.
