Joseph Howard Olmstead (6), third son of Jacob and Mary, was b. 26 Feb 1885 near Salladsburg, Pa. Joe Howard became a master carpenter and then became the head of a construction crew for a firm that did business in many different areas. Apparently, this is what took him to West Virginia where he m. Rebecca Williams who was b. in 1866 in Parkersburg. Thier oldest daughter, Mary who was named for Joe Howard's favorite sister, was b. in Parkersburg.

Then the family moved to Pittsburgh, where the other two girls were born. The family then returned to the Williamsport area, where Joe, Jr. was born. Joe, Sr. remained with the firm as an expert carpenter for many years. Rebecca is remembered as being a staunch and firm, but also kindly woman.

They both died in Williamsport; Rebecca on 31 Jan 1934 and Joe Howard on 4 Ap 1938 and are buried in Wildwood Cemetery. They were members of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America. Children:

The following was presented at a memorial service at the First United Methodist Church, Renovo, Pa. on Sunday, 14 Feb 1971 by ROBERT L. LONG.

"For those of you who knew my Dad, LEROY LONG, and for Mother and the members of our family, I want to take a few moments to share some memories about a very special man. For those of you who didn't know Dad, I hope to introduce him to you, for he was a man worth knowing.

Dad passed away on Tuesday after a lingering illness. During that illness and especially since Tuesday, Mother has received an almost overwhelming expression of love and concern from the many friends of our family. I want to sincerely thank you, for these expressions have had great meaning for all of us.

One man in commenting about a friend who passed on has said, "It is not what he had, nor even what he did, which directly expresses the worth of a man, but what he was."

"My Dad was many things. He was a railroader, a tough old railroader. He loved his work as a yardmaster, and he instilled in his children and his grandchildren a love for the passing era of the railroad, with its steam engines, its diesels, its boxcars, and cabooses.

Dad was a good neighbor and his neighborhood extended to wherever he was and to whomever he was with. He was always going up or down the street to help someone with their storm window, or their door latch, or their leaky faucet. When he traveled, he made friends quickly and often he would end up carrying baggage, or a baby, or helping a lost family find their next train. Through his example, he taught me from my earliest childhood that all persons were of value, regardless of their race, their wealth, or their appearance.

He was a lover of little children, not only his seven grandchildren, but all of the little ones in our neighborhood. MR. LONG, or POP-POP, always had candy for the kids and could be counted on to help them with their building projects by providing materials and advice.

Many times he was a stern taskmaster. He was honest with everyone and expected honesty in return. The only spanking I can remember was the result of my blaming someone else for throwing a ball through the basement kitchen window. Unfortunately, Dad had seen me do it. The window didn't bother him, but he convinced me, on the front porch, in front of the neighborhood kids, that telling the truth was very, very important!

I think most of all, Dad was a toucher of lives. Wherever he was.... in Renovo, in Louisville, visiting my sister, or in New Mexico with us, he was always extending a helping hand. He could be cussing and growling while he did it, but people recognized that he was someone who was willing to help in any way he could.

"One example I have always loved took place as he was driving to Williamsport to meet Mother at the train and do some shopping. As we left Renovo he picked up a hitch-hiker, an older man who was trying to get back to work in Philadelphia after a long illness, at least he said so. Dad decided to help him a little bit further so, instead of stopping in Williamsport, he drove on to Lewisburg where I was a student at Bucknell University.

Just before noon he burst into our room and said to my roommate and I, "Come on, I've got a bum in the car; we're going to take him to lunch." We did! Dad also bought him sandwiches and a carton of cigarettes to take with him and then we took him out to Route 15 to the best spot for hitching a ride. Almost as quickly, Dad dropped Harry and I off at school and went racing back to Williamsport to meet Mother. I guess I've always thought of this story as a "live version" of the Parable of the Good Samaritan.

I know many of you have lost loved ones through the passing years. I ask that you now join me in a few moments of silent prayer, thanking God for their lives, for the joys we shared, for the loved we received."

Mildred Anna Olmstead (30), (Joseph 6, Jacob), was born in Pittsburgh, Pa. on 31 Jan 1903, md. 20 Sep 1929 South Williamsport to William Pennell Stroup, Bill, who had been divorced in 1922, was born in 1891, son of W. T. and Mary (Brownell) Stroup of Williamsport. Bill was an auto mechanic and had his own garage for a number of years. Mildred had been a school teacher and bookkeeper. Bill died on 27 Aug 1966 at the Williamsport Hospital and is buried at the Twin Hills Memorial Park. Their

son of Harry and Elizabeth (Buss) Beal and was born 10 Feb 1900. Lena  
has been a piano teacher and church organist and is a very fine artist  
doing both commercial work and oil or water color paintings; she is also  
expert in making artistic displays and knickknacks out of natural mater-  
ials found in the local woods.

Joe served in the National Guard for five years along the Mexican Border,  
before returning to Williamsport to be a machinist on the railroad. D  
During World War II he was a master sergeant in the Air Force and utili-  
zing his long experience of work with equipment gained from peace-time  
employment with Williamsport Milk Products Co. (Hurr's Dairy), he devel-  
oped the mechanical cow which is used to reconstitute whole milk from  
dry milk solids at military bases and aboard ships. It is simply the  
reversing of the DeLavel separator process but was done within G-2  
(Intelligence) branch of the Air Force. Joe retired from the dairy plant  
in 1965 after 43 years of service with them. They have no children.

Joseph Howard Olmstead (32) (Joseph 6, Jacob) was born 4 Apr 1906 at  
Montoursville, Pa., md. first to Elinor Gallagher in the early 1930's.  
She died of a rheumatic heart condition in the spring of 1940 leaving  
behind two young children. "My children were infants when my first wife  
died so many years ago and Agnes, my present wife took over in a short  
while and raised the children, so actually she is recognized as their  
Mother and always has been" said Joe in a letter for the preparation  
of this genealogy. Married then to Agnes T. O'Day 17 Aug 1940 at Brock-  
lyn, New York where the family was now living. Agnes was born 5 Aug 19...  
in Brooklyn. Joe worked for Kresge Company and was transferred from  
place to place. Patricia had been born when he was in Pawtucket, R. I.  
and Joe. III was born in Brooklyn. During World War II he managed a Post  
exchange at the Fort Meyer, Virginia Army Post.

"Continuing from his letter, "As for myself, I was not actually a travel-  
ing man as such but spent over forty years in the department store busi-  
ness in Pennsylvania, New York, New England, and the South, and moved  
frequently in what might be called a trouble shooting capacity. I retired  
from this business in 1965, but continued to keep active on a shorter  
hour basis as a cost accountant and supervisor with a construction com-  
pany in Danbury, Connecticut. After reaching age 65, I retired and  
moved to Florida with my wife and bought our present home." "I am now  
interested in many hobbies such as rock tumbling and jewelry, hand made  
shell vases, and fancy bottles, wood building of small novel or toy  
replicas and delving into putting all events of importance into rhyming  
verses under the name of "the present poet."

"We will do our best to make the reunion this year (1975) but I do not  
drive long distances and this is a handicap. But maybe we can make it  
somehow since I suppose that I am now one of the oldest direct descen-  
dants of Jacob and Mary.

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


