On this 24th day of July, A.D., one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, personally appeared before me, Frank Cross, the same being a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid; ELVIRA ELIZABETH LONG, age 73 years, a resident of Luling, in the State of Texas, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of HENRY LONG, deceased, who was the identical HENRY LONG, who served under the name of HENRY LONG as a Private in the company command by Captain _____, in the Tennessee Riflemen, Regiment of Infantry commanded by General Coffee, in the War of 1812, that her said husband drafted in Beauford Co., Tenn. on or about the in the Fall of _____ A.D. 1814, for the term of six months, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of until close of the war, and whose services terminated, by reason of the close of the war at New Orleans, after the Battle of New Orleans A.D. 1815. She further states that the following is a full description of her husband at the time of his enlistment, viz; about nineteen years old, blacksmith and farmer, 5 ft. 10 inches high, light sandy hair blue eyes, fair skin.*She further states that she was married to the said HENRY LONG, at the city or town of _____, in the county of Caldwell, and in the State of Texas, on the Twenty-eight day of June 1867 by one T. C. Greenwood, who was a Baptist Minister; and that her name before her marriage was Elvira Elizabeth Grady; and she further states that she and HENRY LONG had both been previously married, HENRY LONG first wife died Caldwell Co., Tx. A. D. 1865 and that her said husband HENRY LONG died at Home, in the State of Texas, on the 16th day of August, A.D. 1867 and that she has not again married; and she further declares that the following have been the places of residence of her said husband since the date of his discharge from the Army, viz: Tennessee, Alabama, Louisiana came to Texas A.D. 1849 Lived in Caldwell Co from about 1850 to 1867 time of his death. Dear Madam:

In your claim for pension as the widow of HENRY LONG, you are required to furnish proof of your marriage to him, and proof of his death, by record evidence, or the testimony of two witnesses who have personal knowledge of the facts and dates. You must also furnish evidence, by the testimony of two witnesses, showing that you have not remarried since his death, and furnish proof of the date of your first husband's death. You must state the age of the soldier at the time of his death and file some paper bearing his signature. As soon as these requirements are complied with your claim will be promptly considered.

Deed, Marion Co., Tn. Roll #46, Book B, Page 286-287:

HENRY LONG to William Morrow. This indenture made the 30th day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty-six between HENRY LONG of the County of Marion and State of Tennessee on the one part and William Morrow of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand dollars to him the said HENRY LONG in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath by these presents bargained sold unto the said William Morrow a certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred acres situated lying and being in the said County of Marion. LONG having served faithfully and honorably for the term of twenty five months from the twentieth day of January 37 until the twenty eighth day of February 1839 and having been honorably discharged is entitled to twelve hundred and eighty acres Bounty Land, for which this is his certificate.

And the said SAMUEL A. LONG is entitled to hold said land, or to sell, alienate, convey and donate the same, and to exercise all rights of ownership over it.

We the board of Land Commissioners of Lavaca County do issue this his unconditional certificate for six hundred and forty acres of land, agreeable to the pervisions of an act of Congress approved the 4th January 1841, extending donations of land to late emigrants. REPUBLIC OF TEXAS DISCHARGE PAPER ON SAMUEL A. LONG

Post West Bernard Feb 20th 1839

Know all men by these presents that SAM A LONG entered the service of the Republic of Texas in the 2nd Regt P Volunteers on the 20th Jan 1837 and the said SAM A LONG having served Honorably and Faithfully up to this date is hereby Honorably Discharged from the Army of Texas. Said SAM A LONG was born in Marion County Ten., is aged 27 yrs, 5'8" high and was entered by Capt. ?briht at New Orleans for during the War, said SAM A LONG has been paid up to the 1st day August 1838 and has pay due him from that time up to the 29th Jan 1839 and from the 10th of Feb up to the time of his discharge having been furloughed for ten days, said LONG has drawn rations up to the 28th Feb 1839. PUBLIC DEBT PAPERS

This is to certify that SAMUEL A. LONG has, under the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the State of Texas, entitled An Act to extend the provisions of "An Act to provide for ascertaininf the Debt of the late REPUBLIC OF TEXAS" approve February 7, 1853, filed with the Auditor and Comptroller a claim for services on the Vasques Campaign in 1842 amounting to Thirty-one and 50/100 dollars; which is sufficiently authenticated to authorize the auditing of the same under the laws of the late Republic of Texas. Said claim, according to the data before us, is worth Thirty-one and 50/100 dollars in par funds, as having been at rate so available to the Government.

In Testimony Whereof, we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals of office, at Austin, this Eighteenth day of January A. D. 1855.
