BIOGRAPHY/ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY:

Hugh Finlay (1732-1801) was the third son of Robert Finlay, a [Glasgow] tanner and cordwainer, and Susanna Finlay (née Parkins). In 1763 he emigrated to Quebec where he became a prominent merchant and politician, as well as the "father of the Canadian post office." Before departure from Britain, Finlay was assured that he would be appointed postmaster of Quebec upon arrival. This was confirmed on 10 June 1763. On 5 January 1773 Finlay was appointed Surveyor of the Post roads in the Continent of North America. On 31 January 1774 he was named one of the two joint deputy postmasters general of North America, but the American Revolution soon made this appointment largely obsolete.

In the summer of 1780, Finlay was appointed superintendent of post houses in Quebec. Originally without a salary, he was able to get the position salaried in 1781. In 1784 he became deputy postmaster general of the province of Quebec. In 1787 he undertook a survey of the postal route between Quebec and Halifax. As a result of this, he recommended unified authority over the entire route and, in 1788, obtained his own appointment as deputy postmaster general of British North America. Financial difficulties led to his dismissal from the Post Office in October 1799. He died on 26 December 1801.

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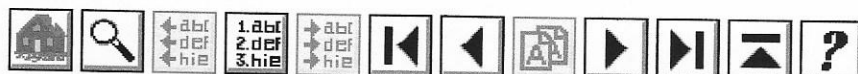
